Mine). One of the finest mineral specimen for sure at the whole show. The same private collector had many other very good specimens including a Petarasite (St.-Hilaire Mt.) and a Quintinite-2H with SjÆgrenite (and Phlogopite) from Kovdor, Kola Peninsula.

Another of my favourites was back at the Himalaya (mostly Pakistani-Afghan) special exhibit, a 17 cm unbelieavable razor sharp Viitaniemiite crystal on lepidolite matrix from Paprok, Afghanistan. This specimen is now in the Vienna Museum and was bought at the Munich Show perhaps 8 years ago. At the time, I saw it and it had already been reserved/sold otherwise it would surely have been my third time I would sell my car for a mineral specimen. It was good to see an old good great friend again.
