Evgeniy Sidorov is our legend

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I met Evgeniy Sidorov in 1987, when he was only 32 years old. He came to Novosibirsk on the eve of his Candidate of Science thesis presentation on Alpine-type ultramafic rocks of eastern Kamchatka. At that time, Evgeniy knew many scientists studying ultramafic objects from our institute and communicated with them. These were AP Krivenko, FP Lesnov, VV Velinskiy, LV Agafonov and others. After successful presentation of his thesis, he subsequently visited Novosibirsk repeatedly. He also travelled to Tomsk, Moscow, and St. Petersburg. He always believed that it is not enough to "stew in your own juice" and needed to test the projects and implement the plans, discussing them with various scientists of our country. When it became possible, he began to do so with the scientists around the world.

Working on the Platinum Project under the guidance of Academician Shilo, he also turned out to be interested in my research on platinum placers of Siberia and once invited me to Kamchatka I fell in love with it at first sight. He introduced me to the deposits of the Kamchatka-Korvak platinum belt.

From that moment, our long-term friendship and joint research began. It led to the publication of dozens of articles in Russia and internationally, including a monograph on Galmoenan, one of the largest platinum-bearing massifs in Kamchatka Our other focus was on alluvial deposits of Kamchatka associated with zonal massifs of Seinay, Mount Filippa, Itchavayam, Prizhimnyi, Pustaya River, as well as pan concentrate halos near ophiolitic ultramafic rocks (Khatyrka and Olkhovaya Rivers). These studies later resulted in both of our doctoral dissertations. It is impossible not to mention our colleagues and the main co-authors of our achievements, including AP Krivenko, MYu Podlipsky, AP Kozlov, and VM Chubarov. Significant stimulus to scientific advancement for Evgeniy Sidorov was informal creative communication with EG Konnikov, BA Markovsky, LI Gurskaya,
